The Inspection Department checks design documents against legal requirements, customer requests, and in-house inspection standards, and inspects the manufacturing process from start to finish. At product completion inspections by customers and in-process inspections by external inspection agencies, we are also able to offer explanations on the content of the inspection, including the processes involved in manufacturing. We are also tasked with creating reports on the results of inspections, applying to government agencies for manufacturing inspection, and creating and issuing certificates of acceptance. The pass/fail decision by our inspection personnel is our last line of defense in preventing product defects. We have a responsibility to ship products that are in line with the conscience of MIURA. We believe that appropriate decisions on our part convert the time that sales personnel and field engineers spend dealing with defects into useful proposal time and inspire our customers to trust the MIURA Group. The Inspection Department digitizes product inspection checksheets to create error detection systems, and offers proposals for inspection tools and the formulation of logical inspection plans, working to reduce the burden on production divisions and stabilize quality. When all inspections are complete, we apply a QC approved sticker to products to indicate that they have passed inspection. When we have been certified by external inspection agencies and been able to apply the QC approved sticker with confidence, there is a feeling of achievement in being able to ship the products that everyone in design and manufacturing has made.
