MIURART Village is an art museum co-located with an atelier, which was planned by our founder Tamotsu Miura before his death, and constructed in 1998. An artist as well as an entrepreneur, Miura broke new ground in the field of ceramics, and in his later years created ceramic panel paintings christened "MIURART" by those with knowledge in the field. Many examples of MIURART are on display in the grounds of the facility. Our founder's wish that the employees of his company be able to enjoy art has become one of our goals, and we hope to make high-quality artwork familiar to both our employees and to the local community. The art adorning our head office and each of our facilities is part of this effort. As a corporate with its own art museum, we believe that providing our employees with more opportunities to encounter art, as our founder enjoyed it, will allow them to leverage this in experience in communicating with customers, and enjoy greater fulfillment in their private lives. We hold five special exhibitions a year, and the events that a community-focused museum such as this can hold have made us popular with local people. It's a pleasure to have people complement us on a recent exhibition. Many local elementary students come to view the exhibitions, and we hold sculptors' workshops for junior high school students, acting as a venue that offers an important opportunity for people to experience art at an early stage in their lives. While we are a corporate art museum, we also contribute to the region as an art museum open to the local community.
