A manufacturer of industrial-use washing machines, Inax Corporation is the number one integrated engineering firm in Japan. The company has adopted "Quality Above All" as a slogan for manufacturing, working from this to offer reliable quality. Since joining the MIURA Group in 2017, the people at Inax have turned their hands to offering not just washing machines and driers, but total solutions for laundry factories as a whole, including boilers.

Laundry factories must make efficient use of waste heat and water from cleaning. Large factories use many hundreds of tons of water each day, which means that recycling water is extremely important in terms of cost and the environment. Because high temperature water of 80°C is used for cleaning, making effective use of its heat rather than discarding warm water as-is also leads to further energy savings. Utilizing the technologies of the MIURA Group to address these needs is creating synergies. Another concern is saving in manpower and labor. It is said that one-third of the costs in running a laundry factory is spent for labor, and with the industry's image of being a dirty, dangerous, and difficult one in which to work, we are offering solutions with transport systems and sorting equipment, and are moving ahead with automation. We may alter the business processes, beginning with planning the building, such as setting up the factories receiving and sorting areas on the second floor. We are also applying ourselves to maintenance, and will evolve to preventative maintenance as we work to achieving unmanned factories that work 365 days a year. By eliminating waste from laundry factories and maintaining stable levels of production and quality, we are keeping cleanliness. That is our mission.
